Enclosed are the photocopies of the pertinent pages from the probate file. Most of the other pages were receipts, docket pages, etc. – nothing of real interest. I was surprised not to find a will. The note on top seems to indicate that some papers were removed from the file and destroyed in 1941. Most interesting.

It is a shame that this probate research is so time consuming and expensive. The San Diego Superior Court does not make it easy to conduct research there, particularly for older records. I trust that you will find this information most useful.
